Class Visits

In Mrs Warry's Year 7 Drama class students are busy learning all about the elements of Drama. Their lesson started with the students working in pairs to correctly sort the different elements of drama. They had to race to get it done first and enjoyed the challenge. Then as a whole class they were each given a different element and had to place them again in order. The students certainly demonstrated they understood what each element was and how they work together to create dramatic meaning. To cement their learning they then participated in a learning experience called Shark Attack. The students were in the roles of different sea creatures and had to experience going with and against the current as well as constantly being on alert for shark attacks. This movement with the inclusion of music helped demonstrate how tension builds and how mood can be created in performance. These budding actors are all enjoying their learning experiences in drama and developing their skill sets in engaging and fun ways.

In Ms Pearl's Year 10 science class students are learning about how energy affects motion. They have been looking at the different types of energy and how to calculate potential and kinetic energy mathematically so that can quantify energy changes in system. Working on their own devices as part of our BYOD program the students are completing an energy booklet. They make great use of class time because anything not completed in class is done for homework. Their work with kinetic and potential energy will include a range of experiments such as investigating the most efficient roller coaster design. This challenging experiment will help students to apply the concepts of motion & energy they learned to calculate energy efficiency of a roller coaster and how to harness that energy when designing a roller coaster. What a great way to learn the theory of science through exciting and motivating experiments.


Kindergarten

Languages

Japanese:

Year 3 Japanese: Our Year 3 students have completed their portfolio piece! They produced an A4-sized name card that includes information about themselves, such as their name, age, school name, class name, favourite colours and animals all in Japanese. Please watch out for that!

Year 5 Japanese: Year 5 students have been continuing to learn hiragana. Students are progressing well and producing some beautiful script.

Year 6 Japanese: Students are finishing off the unit on introducing themselves and others. They are also continuing their learning of hiragana reading and writing.

Year 7 Japanese: Students have begun a unit on countries. We have focussed on extending our knowledge of katakana and talking about where we are from and what our nationality is.

Year 8 Japanese: Year 8 have finished the unit on dates and events. We have now started a new unit on sports and hobbies. This will be a good chance for students to apply their prior learning talking about the things they love to do in their spare time.

Year 9 Japanese: Year 9 are well into working on their writing projects. It is great to see some very creative minds at work. There are trailers for horror movies, strange new reports and interesting books being produced.

Year 10 Japanese: Year 10 continue to apply their learning around adjectives. We have also been experimenting a lot with google classroom to share understandings and questions. It is proving to be a great tool for learning!

French:

Year 4 French: Our Year 4 students worked on the days and months of the year in French. They did an exercise on this topic and listened to a song about the 12 months. They sang very well.

Year 5 French: Year 5 have been preparing their portfolio piece on animals. In this task students write and read about a variety of animals.

Year 6: Students are working on verbs for different activities and expressing likes and dislikes. Try asking your child what they like and don't like.

Year 7: Year 7 worked on vocabulary for clothes and have consolidated their learning through a variety of exercises. They have also practiced basic conversations and have completed assessment.

Year 8: Year 8 are continuing to work on vocabulary for daily activities through a range of activities. Some classes have moved on to adjectives to describe people and things. One student participated in the *Concours George Vincent* and passed the listening test. Well done!

Year 9/10: Students worked on the use of past tense and the imperfect. One student participated in the *Concours George Vincent* which is run by the Alliance Française.

Technology no substitute for reading time

Leading children's author Mem Fox finds it "heartbreaking" to see small children left alone with smartphones and tablets to entertain themselves, saying an increasing reliance on technology to teach children how to read could inhibit their empathy and social skills. Fox said parents must keep reading books – either paper or ebooks – with their children to interpret the characters and help the child comprehend the story.

"One of the things that bothers me most is that people seem to think that kids can be left alone with technology, [but] they would be less likely to leave the child alone with a pile of books at the age of two or three," she said. "It is the aloneness that is heartbreaking."

Fox said she was also sick of parents boasting about a child's ability to use technology while ignoring the child's concentration skills or ability to handle a book properly. She is preparing for a national tour to promote her new book Baby Bedtime and her comments were echoed by children's literacy and technology experts. Fox said sales of her paper books were still strong in Australia, while royalties from ebooks suggested they were not selling at all. While Fox admits to loving technology and occasionally using it to occupy her own grandson, she feels too many parents have replaced parenting time with technology.

"Really, why do we have children if we can't spend some time with them? It is just not right for the child. If we can't spend time with our kids, we shouldn't be having them."

Apps had no beginning, middle or end, and did not describe forgiveness or courage in adversity, said the author of Possum Magic and Where is the Green Sheep?.

Emotions like empathy were only developed if adults helped children see when sad, scary or nasty things were done to characters in a book or an app, she added, citing concerns with apps such as Tom the Talking Cat, which encourages players to punch a cat.

Macquarie University lecturer in early childhood language and literacy Emilia Djonov said the real benefit of parents or teachers reading to children was the adults' ability to encourage children to relate the story or images back to their own life. This helped children's comprehension of what they were reading and was missing when technology took the place of an adult.

Kate Highfield, also a lecturer at Macquarie University's institute of early childhood, said interactive books could distract children who were learning to read because the books focused on animations and sounds rather than meaning.

"While this adds some 'fun', it's important that ebooks are just one small part of a child's time with text and for this reason, we really need to ensure that children still have access to quality books and shared reading with a traditional book," Dr Highfield said. She also warned against leaving children unsupervised with devices for more than a few minutes.

"I suggest that parents think of tablets and mobile technologies as a digital playground and, just as you wouldn't leave your child in the park alone, we shouldn't leave them alone in the digital park."




